Bio

Though prominent in history, I have strived to reimagine myself over the years, restoring my Lace Market to serve a new purpose as an area dedicated to creative businesses, where locals can live, work, eat, shop and learn. Similarly, my famed castle is undergoing its own transformation, showing my ambition and dedication to continually evolve. For example, I am the first city to have used Braille on my signage.

Nottingham Castle overlooks the city and signifies years of history, stretching back to the 11th century. It stands alongside the Sherwood Foresters Regimental Museum and the Castle Museum and Art Gallery. Treasures from the past fill the walls of my museums, be it medals, jewellery, sculptures, paintings or ancient carvings. In the summer, the castle grounds host outdoor theatre for residents across the city.

I have several impressive landscapes, including the Arboretum, Embankment and Colwick parks. The famed Sherwood Forest is also close by.

I have a strong history when it comes to football – Notts County was founded in 1862, making them the oldest professional football club in the world. In 1978 Nottingham Forest were only the third team to win the European Cup on the first attempt. Beyond football, Nottingham Panthers play ice hockey at the indoor ice rink, while the National Water Sports Centre, Tennis centre and Trent Bridge international cricket ground show even more choice. I also enjoy caving, as over 450 caves lie beneath the city and are open to explore.

Architecture:

I boast a 5.5-acre market square – the biggest in the UK. It's a great meet-up spot and is often the backdrop to local events. A popular one is the German Christmas Market every December, which fills the square with food, drink and festivities.

Music:

I have a well-established music scene, with regular gigs from local artists at The Bodega and Rescue Rooms, to the Motorpoint Arena that has seen famous faces including The Killers, Katy Perry and Lady Gaga grace its stage. Rock City has seen 35 years of grunge, punk, Brit-pop, hip hop, and rock, an eclectic mix that has something for everyone.
